Make a reasonable attempt to notify the student's parents of each unexcused absence prior to the start of the following school day.		
Make a reasonable attempt to determine the cause of the unexcused absence, including through contact with the student's parents.		
Evaluate the appropriateness of action taken to identify in consultation with the student's parents needed action designed to address patterns of unexcused absences, if any, and to have the child return to school and maintain regular attendance.		
 Develop an action plan to establish outcomes based upon the student's patterns of unexcused absences and to specify the interventions for supporting the student's return to school and regular attendance, which may include any or all of the following: Refer or consult with the building's intervention and referral services team, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-8; Conduct testing, assessments or evaluations of the student's academic, behavioral and health needs; Consider an alternate educational placement; Make a referral to or coordinate with a community-based social and health provider agency or other community resource; Refer to a court or court program pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4iv; Proceed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 9:6-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-10 if a potential missing or abused child situation is detected; and Engage the student's family. 		

Students with More than 10 Cumulative Absences Policies/Procedures

Continue to consult with the parent and the involved agencies to support the student's return to school and regular attendance.		
Cooperate with law enforcement and other authorities and agencies, as appropriate.		
Proceed in accordance with <i>N.J.S.A.</i> 18A:38-28 through 31 and other applicable state and federal statutes, as required.		

Students with up to Four Cumulative Absences Sent to a Receiving School Policies/Procedures
