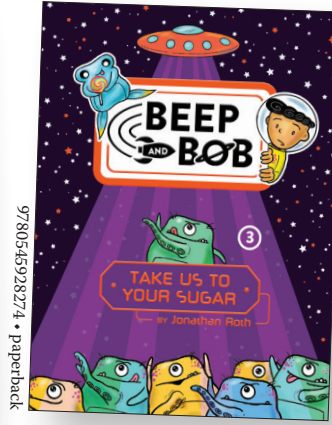
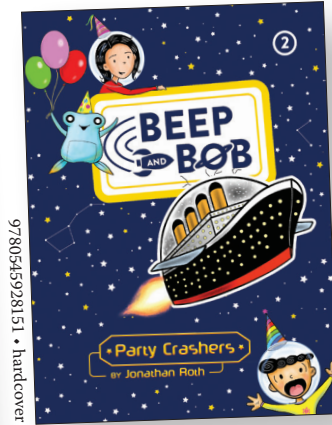

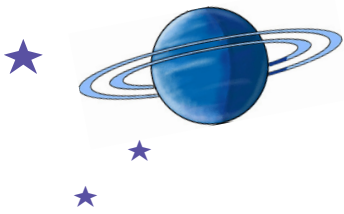


## BEEP AND BOB

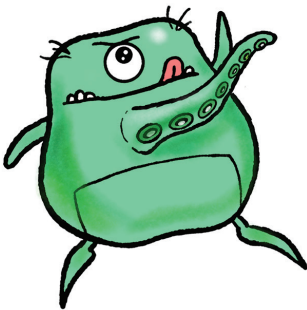

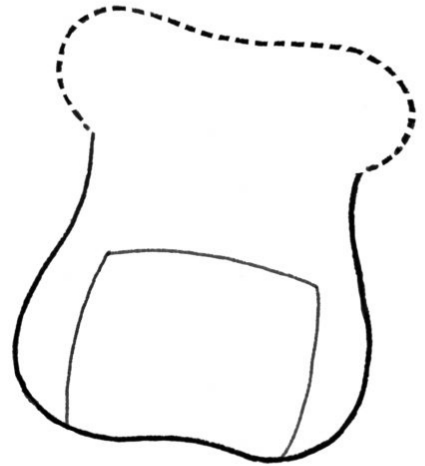


# How to Draw Beep

Add body and pouch

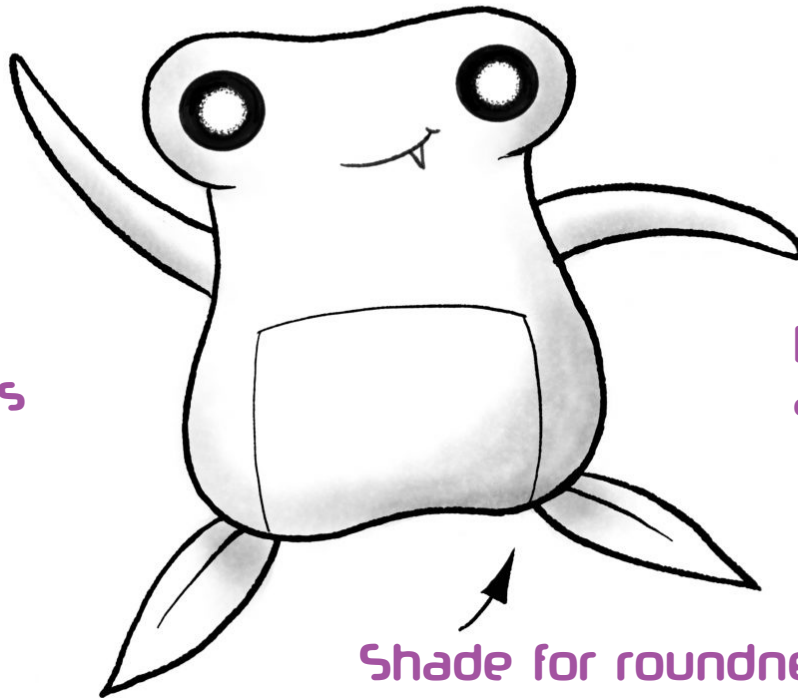


Arms are thin with rounded tips

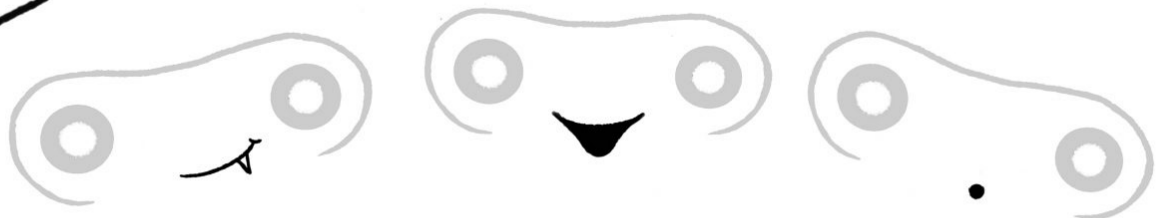


His pupils are white

Feet are wider with pointy tip



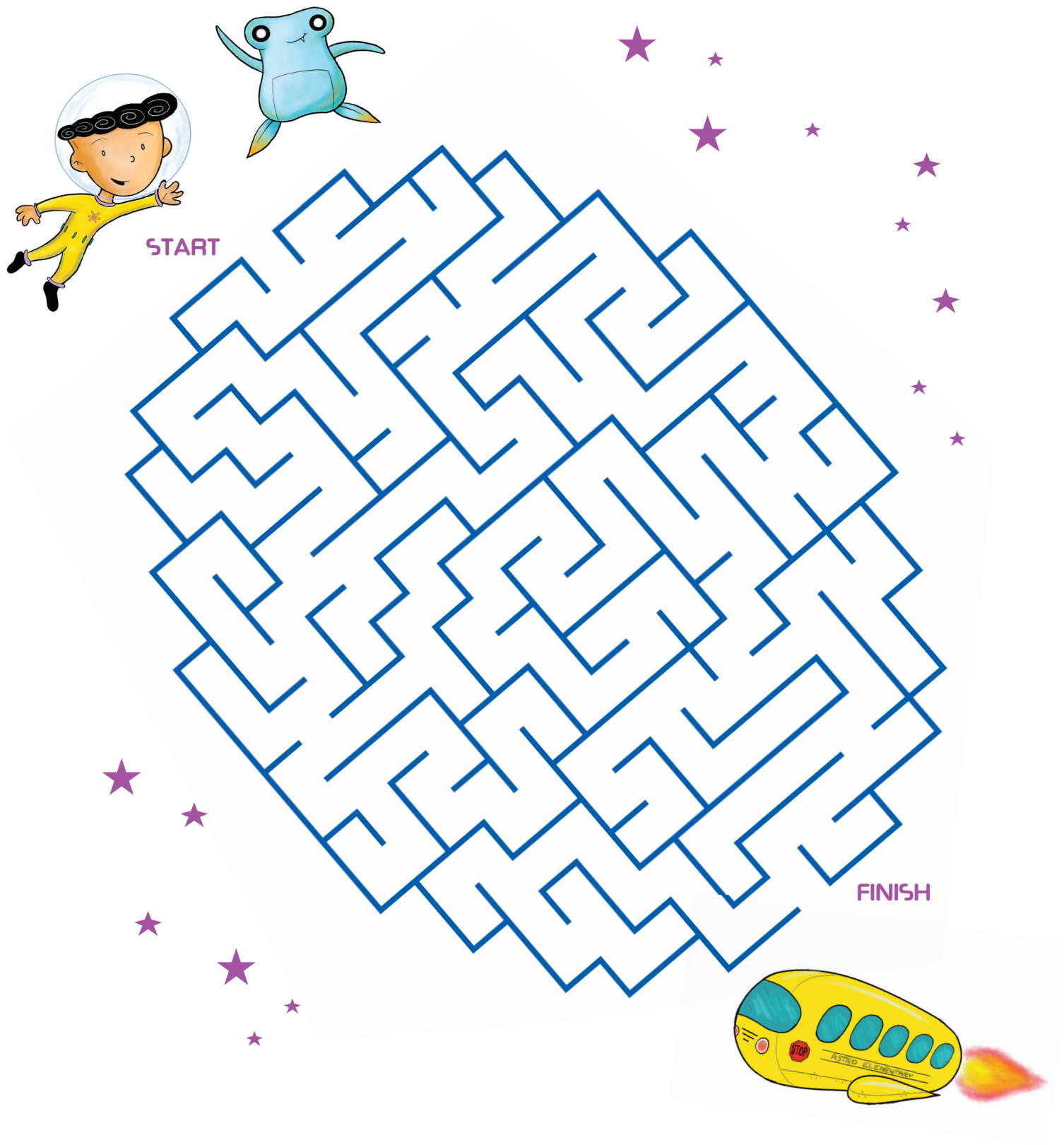
Shade for roundness

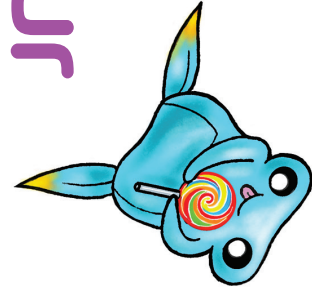
# Treat Bag

## Instructions:

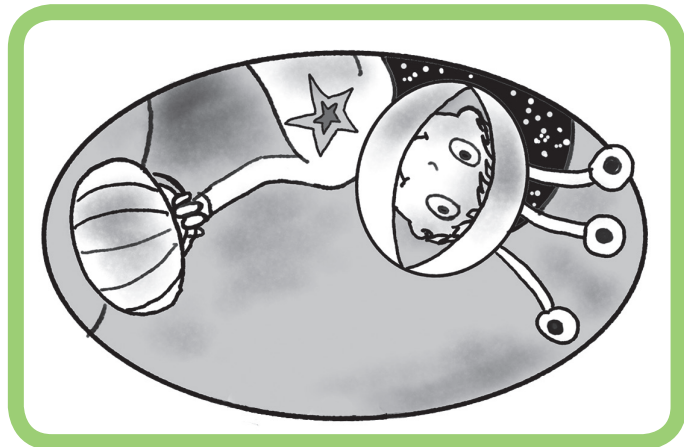

Turn your treat bag over to create the bottom by tucking the smaller flaps in first and finishing with the yellow flap. Tape to secure. Fill with candy!

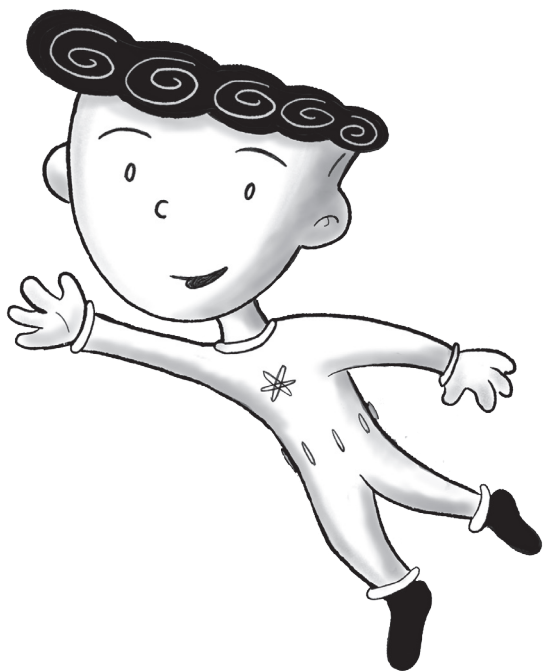
